Governors Meeting

On Monday, governors had their final meeting of this school year. We looked at how the school is dealing with some of the challenges of the educational climate, especially attendance. Attendance remains a priority for all schools but Stroud Valley is currently below national average. Governors are hoping that a number of new initiatives, including flagging persistent absence to the local authority through their 'notice to improve system, which may lead to court fines, will start to improve this figure.

We gave a very thorough look at the numbers of SEN children in the school and the support that is available. The school is fortunate in having such a dedicated and capable SENCO to help us.

The Headteacher provided us with the results of the phonics test which show that by the end of Year 2 our children have a pass rate above the national average which is a great achievement!

Governors also looked at how they can best support areas of learning that have been identified as key priorities for 2025-2026. The government is expected to publish the results of its curriculum review in the new academic year which the school will plan to implement throughout the year. Governors remain impressed at the level of care and commitment shown by all our staff to all our children.
